3. OEC Kit

Students should start carrying an OEC kit to all classes beginning on Saturday, September 11th. Kit can be in any bag and should include: 6 triangular bandages; assorted other bandages: 4x4, 3x3, Band-Aids; watch with seconds display; 3 pairs of medical gloves each in its own plastic bag.

- 8. CPR – required to be a ski patroller, but not required for OEC. You may get CPR certification (*CPR for the professional Rescuer* NOT *Community CPR*) from any authorized American Heart Association or American Red Cross trainer. This is your opportunity to get it here. Elsewhere, this is an 8 hour class and costs more.**

A CPR class will be available during the course = date and time is still TBD. There will be a fee for the purchase of a non-rebreather mask, another text and use of equipment.
